


We all need to encourage the spirit that sustains the people and organizations who have done so much for writers like myself by supporting writers and introducing readers to works that might other-

wise go unheard and unread. Feminist and independent bookstores offer a home to the kind of work that shapes and sustains the best of our communities, and they deserve — need — your support.
