I recently discovered the artistry of Renee Locks who has created some unique and wonderful cards by using calligraphy for the sayings and beautiful tree, flower and women imagery in pastel brush strokes for the art work. These are a must in any store. Her "Ain't I a Woman" series (colored copies) retail for only \$2. Hundreds of other cards are handmade to fill each order and range from \$4-\$10 retail. One of our best new sellers is T-shirts from Kiki, 500 N. Robert St., Suite 302, St. Paul MN 55101, 612-222-8102. Wholesale \$9 and \$9.50. Min. order \$100. (She's the one who did the Bookwoman shirt). They are brightly colored with woman-focused artwork. Her cards are great also. Another new item I've been selling well is Moon Runes from

Our children's section has always been on our priority list and now that we have expanded, we have a nice area for kids to play so we are seeing what a difference that makes for single parents who come into the store. They really appreciate our having a place that is safe for the kids. So, we have more moms, dads and kids and that means more purchasing in their department! And the new toys for sale are doing great.

New and popular sidelines at Old Wives' Tales recently have been "Freedom Rings" in rainbow colors for Gay/Lesbian Pride (Universal Spada, 212-888-1214) and buttons from Ephemera, which offers a variety of "clean" and "rude" buttons, including many feminist and lesbian/gay slogans and designs (275 Capp St., San Francisco CA 94110, 415-552-4199); our bestseller from Ephemera: "So many men, so little reason to sleep with any of them!"

My favorite new line of jewelry is called Manali. They're beautiful, brightly painted wood; very light earrings. They may also have necklaces, but we don't do much with that. We do order some of their figures (statue-like pieces) and are just trying their clocks!! We found this line through a rep named Vera Zaskevich, 415-389-0426. I don't know if Manali has a catalog. Write them at PO Box 1139, Makawao, Maui HI 96768 or call 800-962-6254. We also continue to do well with Lightstones by Sandi Woodbury (7303 South Ave., Sebastopol CA 95472, 707-829-9403). They are handpainted ceramic stones, one side has a design, the other a meditation word (balance, courage, faith, love, magic, peace, prosperity, etc.). They're \$2 each, minimum \$40. We sell a lot of them. The Alchemists have a great line of jewelry that was introduced to us by Heidi Hydusik of The Mulberry Co. (who also reps Jane Sipe's jewelry to us.) Since the day it first arrived in November '90, we have re-ordered THREE times!!! Their catalog and order form seems a bit overwhelming to me - too many choices - but if you just tell then how much you want to spend, they'll send a selection of their best-selling designs. They also supply a handsome wooden display that can be used on a counter top or mounted on the wall. Medium size earrings cost \$6 per pair and there's no minimum. Shipping time is 24-48 hours. Mama Bears in Oakland, CA is selling black and white bumperstickers that read "Caution: Thelma and Louise on board". Alice Molloy had this to say about Thelma and Louise in a recent Mama Bears newsletter: "Here is is the end of July and Thelma and Louise are still on lots of minds. There is daily mention of them here at Mama Bears. Interesting. Karen Ripley, of Over Our Heads Improv Comedy Group bursts into Mama Bears and says, 'They're not dead! The car landed in water! They jumped out and swam to Mexico! They're living in Mexico!'

They are alive, that's for sure. I find myself humming the Joe Hill song thusly: 'I dreamed I saw Louise last night/alive as you and me; Louise I said you're 10 weeks dead/I never died said she. I never died said she.' And then, later on in that song: 'The part that they forgot to kill/went on to organize. Went on to organize.' That movie sure organized feelings in a lot of women's minds." — Mama Bears, Oakland CA

A Different Light San Francisco does a tremendous amount of sidelines business, most of it activistoriented. We sell Gran Fury's "Kissing Doesn't Kill" poster, the "Read My Lips" T-shirt from ACT UP, and handmade pink and black enamel triangle pins and earrings by a local lesbian craftswoman J. Stone. She

also has a bisexual pride pin that sells well now. We sell magnets distributed through Womontyme Distribution, cassettes and CDs of women artists from Sweet Honey in the Rock to The Breeders, and loads of other T-shirts, including a very colorful T with a labrys, women's symbol and pink triangle on it from Dragonfly Graphics. But perhaps our fastest growing store section and my own personal favorite are the queer 'zines. If you haven't clued in yet to the 'zine explosion, do so now, and watch dyke publications with names like GirlJock, Cunt, Screambox, On Our Rag and Taste of Latex fly off your racks. The best way to make your store 'zine friendly is to simply start carrying them...word of mouth spreads incredibly fast in the underground. Also check Fact Sheet Five, a 'zine listing 'zines, for new titles (Fact Sheet Five, c/o Mike Gunderloy, 6 Arizona Ave., Rensselaer NY 12144). Women are hungry for alternative visions of dyke/queer sexuality, and 'zines - primarily photocopied and selling retail for under \$5 -- are well worth the special care and consignment hassles they tend to entail. Stores wanting specifics should contact me (Rachel Pepper) for detailed information on our best selling 'zines. - A Different Light, San Francisco CA

The sidelines that do well for us are: 1) Ceramic pins from People's Pins, 9412 First Drive SE, Everett WA 98208, retail \$2, wholesale \$1.25 per pin with a 20% discount for prepaid orders. They have feminist, lesbian, gay and progressive symbols and slogans (i.e., "One struggle, many fronts" and our bestseller is a large ceramic pink triangle). 2) Buttons/ bumperstickers/postcards from Donnelly Colt, Box 188, Hampton CT 06247; 203-455-9621. They carry a variety of feminist, lesbian, gay and progressive buttons and bumperstickers (pink triangle stickers, "Feminism spoken here" stickers). 3) Cards. We order from a lot of different places but the bestselling cards are j stone (don't have address, sorry) and Amber Lotus-Dharma Enterprises, 1241 21st St., Oakland CA 94607. Tibetan women cards and contemporary artists series sell well here. Cards retail for \$1.25 or \$1.50, bookstore terms \$100 and 50% discount.

My favorite sideline is the Goddess Pin — a creation of Moon Joyce, a Manitoban artist and musician. A card accompanies the purchase of each pin or earrings.

Among FBN's current raves is a wonderfully gay deck of playing cards. New Zealander Paula Clayton advertises her "Mighty Queer Pack" as playing cards with a difference: "No Jokers, Kings, Jacks, Tom, Dick or Harrys in this lot! Just good old 100% lezzie fun. Now wouldn't you rather collect Maids or Butches when you play Canasta, Gin Rummy and the like? It's a drag having to collect a Jack when you'd much rather have a Maid. We've been through that - Boring!" Boring these cards are not. The lavender backs feature the words "The Mighty Queer Pack" and a women's symbol; the face side includes colorful handdrawn pictures. Not only has Clayton replaced Jacks and Kings with Butches and Maids (including impressions of a Protest Marcher, Crone, Witch, Bar Dyke, Joan of Arc, Sappho and others) she also transformed the traditional suits into women's symbols, labryses and double triangles. The only drawback to this deck is that some players won't be willing to throw down their cards — who wants to give up an Amazon or a winking Nun?! Each pack comes in either an orange or lavender box with lesbian-tailored rules for playing

canasta. \$13 a pack plus postage. \$10 a pack for bookstores. Postage varies from \$4.30 a pack for airmail (approximately two weeks), to \$3.70 a pack for surface air lift (about a month) and \$2.50 a pack for sea mail (can take three months or more). # RECYCLED PAPER: Transitional Complexities

Recently there has been a sharp increase in consumer desire for products printed on recycled paper, particularly in my field, the card industry. This interest follows an expanded awareness and concern over what we have been doing to the environment, and what (particularly simple things) we might do to make a change. This development is very positive. Even the National Stationary Show, typically a very mainstream event, featured a special display of "earth-friendly" products this year.

However, there is a growing trend among some shop owners that disturbs me. I've visited an increasing number of shops where the buyer will start out by saying, "I only want to see cards on recycled paper. Don't even show me any others." It seems that some have decided that a hard-line purist policy is a great idea at this time.

I question this decision. Recycling is a complex issue and a range of perspectives needs to be examined if we are to make positive changes. Don't get me wrong, as a distributor of cards I have some excellent items that have come out on recycled paper and I'd love to see them spread far and wide. In fact, I can outline some of the successes and good sources for recycled paper product along the way. But, if all this is going to have any positive outcome for the earth, we need to look deeper, to discuss the tough issues and to discuss ways to move the concern beyond a fad or a quick fix.

First, the very definition of "recycled paper" is overly broad. What percentage of the paper is recycled fiber? And, more importantly, how much (if any) is post-consumer recycled? Paper mills have always recycled the pre-consumer waste (scrap from the printing floor) and most paper contains some percentage of this. A few years ago much of this paper was not called recycled for fear that consumers would think it was inferior quality. But now that recycled is in demand, the term can be used and a higher price charged although there is still no post-consumer content. This is a good example of environmental "green washing;" it may sell more products, but it in no way helps the earth.

One of the oldest companies to be doing high-integrity recycled paper printing, Earth Care Paper

Company<sup>1</sup>, is considering printing the percentage of post-consumer content on their cards. If this is done right and catches on, it could well revolutionize the market since at present there is no way to tell what "recycled paper" really means. Watch for their fall catalog.

What are the issues for the card publishers? If a company has a large stock of cards already printed on non-recycled paper, they must sell those before they can reprint on recycled stock (reduce and reuse before recycling, remember). If stores selling them suddenly cut them off, it will take longer to do so.

Many small publishers need to look carefully at the price of recycled paper and quantity of paper purchased at one time. We are told that only if the consumer demand increases will the price drop and

recycling become standard process. Is this really true? The timber industry receives massive subsidies from our tax dollars encouraging the clearcutting of virgin forest, even ancient forests. As long as these subsidies are in place, the price of virgin pulp will probably stay well below that of recycled pulp. This in turn provides a disincentive to big manufacturers to retool

their plants to produce recycled paper.

To change this requires reaching Congress and countering the effects of the timber lobby. By joining Save America's Forests Coalition<sup>2</sup> you can be a part of this effort. Even though public demand for recycled paper has increased, current output of recycled paper accounts for only 1 percent of the 22 million tons of virgin printing paper produce annually in the US<sup>3</sup>. Is there any information about whether this figure is changing at all? And is there a well-thought-out, multi-faceted strategy for changing it? All too often, the small publisher is caught between new public demands and a slow-changing paper production in-

juana comes from Indian hemp) production and use the plant to manufacture paper (a very popular practice in the past.) He maintains that the yield of paper per acre is several times higher, the quality is higher, it can be recycled more times, and has no need for chlorine bleaching. While he predicts that this would make hemp the single largest agriculture crop in the country, it runs against the profit potential of the timber industry. This would, of course, change many things.

Another important issue is the quality of artwork produced on cards, particularly if paper is post-consumer, uncoated or unbleached. Some images look great on recycled stock, while others lose a lot. One

dustry. Many artists and small companies are able to produce high-quality cards on non-recycled paper in fairly small quantities at a low cost. But when they inquire about switching to recycled stock (particularly post-consumer), they are often told it is not available, or that to get the paper at an affordable price, they must purchase a quantity that far exceeds their needs, which becomes financially prohibitive. The problems small producers face are often discounted by those who favor a hard-line recycled-paper-only approach.

What about the chlorine bleaching process used in paper making and to de-ink post-consumer recycled paper? This process, used to make paper white, releases toxic dioxins into the environment. Some groups, such as Greenpeace, call this process "the single most devastating part of the production of

> nies in Sweden have adopted a chlorinefree bleaching process, but such paper is not available in the United States. Leeds Postcards in England is now printing some of their cards on this "environmental friendly" paper from Sweden. One author re-

cently suggested that the real solution is to legalize hemp (marimust choose carefully to find the most appropriate paper. Obviously, if it doesn't look good and sell, it will not do anyone any good, no matter what it is printed on. Some artists have printed on recycled stock, then gone back to non-recycled because of quality loss and cost. Others, such as Irene Nicolas of Snaketales, has her original line of cards on virgin pulp stock and a new series on recycled paper from Brush Dance<sup>5</sup>. The look is very different, and time will tell how this affects sales and future publishing plans.

As I spoke with those who only wanted to consider cards on recycled stock, I asked if the same applied to books. The reply was always quick, "Of course not, books are educational." While it is good to see that more books are being printed on recycled paper, I was relieved to see that they saw past having form rule over content when it came to books. To do otherwise would be a sort of censorship. And yet, cards can be educational as well.

In fact, the idea that cards can carry a powerful message has been a central focus of my business for five years now. The right image can equal one thousand words. Cards, whether sent through the mail or posted on a fridge, can reach people who wouldn't read a book. They can be cheaper to produce and to purchase than many items, perhaps making them recession-proof. Of course, there are plenty of cards that do not in any way educate, but there is no reason that they can't.

And perhaps this is really my point. What we really need to save the earth (or more to the point, to save ourselves as part of the earth) is not another product, be it recycled paper or low-flow showerheads. What we need more than anything is a change of consciousness. About how we see ourselves, our relation to the earth and to each other. Can we develop a vision of life without domination, discrimination and exploitation? Can we map a strategy for moving in that direction? Is there a way to communicate and educate?

My suggestion to shop buyers is yes, add more recycled paper items. That is a positive step. But look for items that educate about the issues that are important to you. Whether the paper is recycled or not, look at the content that is printed on it, make sure it counts, that it educates. We need not think of education in purely intellectual, wordy terms. Images, humor and beauty can also play a big part.

### Obituary: Gale Wilhelm 1908-1991

Gale Wilhelm, celebrated novelist, author of six novels written between 1935 and 1945, died peacefully at her home in the Bay Area of San Francisco on July 11, 1991.

The cause of death was cancer, according to her lover of 43 years, who was with her at the time of her death. She remained at home during the course of her brief illness, as she wished to do.

Born April 26, 1908, in Eugene, Oregon, daughter of Ethel Gale Brewer and Wilson Price Wilhelm, Gale Wilhelm was educated in Oregon, Idaho, and Washington. As a young adult she moved to the Bay Area near San Francisco and lived there for ten years. In 1935, after Random House accepted her first novel, the classic lesbian love story, *We Too Are Drifting*, for publication, she was offered Associate Editorship of *Literary America* and moved to New York City for a year. In 1936, she returned to California, living in Oakdale from 1938 until 1948 and then in Berkeley until her death.

After We Too Are Drifting was published to rave reviews in all the media of the time, Random House also published her second novel, not lesbian, No Letters for the Dead and her third, Torchlight to Valhalla, another classic lesbian love story. Wilhelm went on to produce three more novels, but never returned to the subject of lesbianism overtly in any of them, though argument can be presented to the effect that her heroes are often heroines in disguise. We Too Are Drifting and Torchlight to Valhalla remain high on the list of classic lesbian novels considered mandatory reading. She is survived, in addition to her lover, by nieces, nephews, a grand niece and two grand nephews.

Our TP, Kleenex and paper towels are recycled products and of course we have the usual California yellow toilet! Our vendors are recyclers, too. They reuse boxes and packing materials and we do too if we mail anything out. I take all the excess plastic popcorn and packing paper to the local "packaging" store and they reuse it. We don't use many shopping bags in the store because our customers don't take bags when they don't need them and we reuse plastic and paper shopping bags when they are needed. It's become a way of life — it used to require thinking and remembering but now it's part of the routine.
